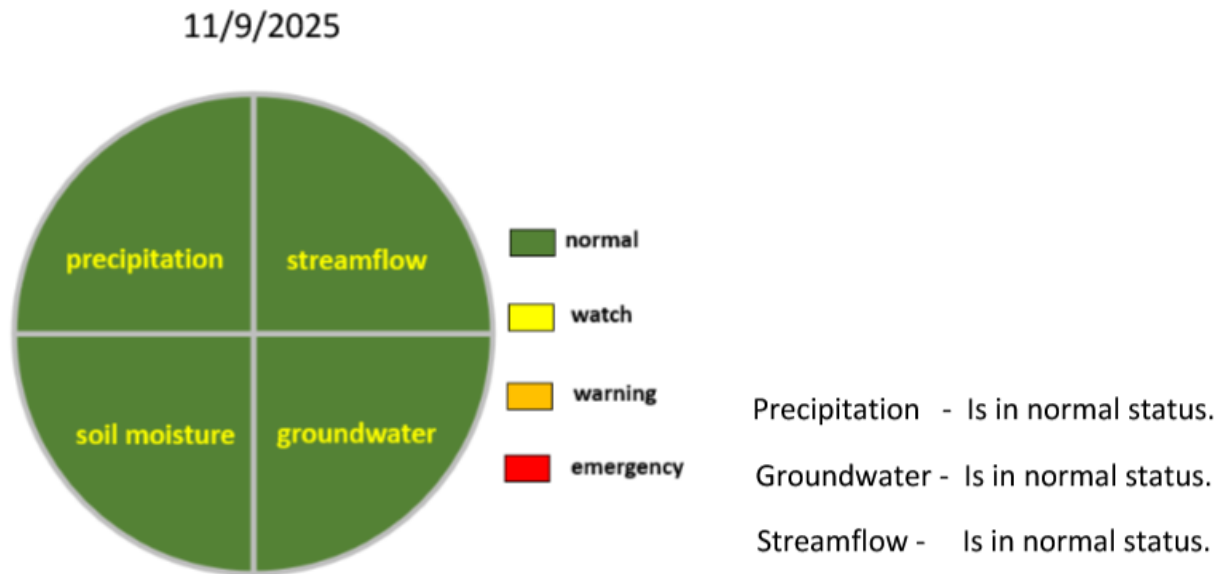


Greetings,

The Hydrologic Status (formerly Drought Monitor) has been updated with the recent data download from our Continuous Monitoring Network of homeowner wells.



Precipitation

Over the past 90 days, 9.9 inches of precipitation fell at Palisades High School which is 72% of the 13.8 inches average for Bucks County. This amount is just at the normal/watch border.

Over the past 365 days, 48.5 inches of precipitation fell at Palisades High School which is 97% of the 50.1 inches average for Bucks County and within the normal range.

Groundwater

Although groundwater levels are still declining toward a seasonal low and at some locations are below median seasonal lows, the levels are not abnormally low, hence the normal status designation.

Streamflow

The average flow over the past 30 days (10/10/2025 to 11/8/2025) on the Tohickon Creek @ Pipersville was 37.0 cfs. The average flow for the same 30 days from 1974 to 2025 is 34.6 cfs. The watch level is 13.6 cfs.

So, our groundwater indicators are stable for this time of year. We are fortunate in our area, as 29 counties in Pennsylvania are under a Drought Watch!
